# Action 2.2

## Roadmap for priority-driven implementation

### Issues

- Harmonisation and full implementation for all data is considered cumbersome.
- Broad data scope has led to strongly deviating data offerings.

### Main objectives

- Drive the further implementation (data and services availability, accessibility and interoperability) of the INSPIRE Directive by a real demand and tangible use cases (building on Action 2.1 data priorities)
- Introduce compliance maturity levels while assuring legal compliance (building on the work under the old Action 2016.1 on fitness for purpose).
- Gather evidence for a possible review of the INSPIRE Directive

# Action 2.2

## Roadmap for priority-driven implementation

### Tasks

- Task 1: Identifying the flexibilities of the legal framework, building on previous simplification efforts.
- Task 2: Develop implementation maturity levels based on the level of interoperability, data priorities and identified legal flexibility (incl. legal validation).
- Task 3: Impact assessment of the proposal on existing and future implementation (also in view of a possible review of the INSPIRE Directive).
- Task 4: Pilot the proposed maturity levels on selected data sets.
- Task 5: Draft guidance (legal, political, technical) on application of maturity levels.

## Action 2.2 Workgroup

- Call for nomination for experts was launched on 17 February 2021
- 6 Member States (AT, CZ, EL, ES, NL,SK) nominated 7 experts.
- Workgroup collaboration environment will be set up on the INSPIRE MIF GitHub (<https://github.com/INSPIRE-MIF>)
- First meeting will be planned for May 2021
