

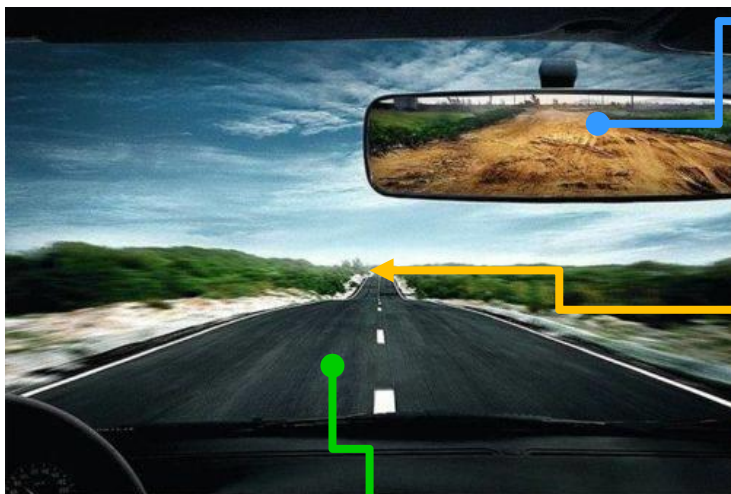

## Priority List of eReporting datasets

- Priority list v1.2
  - **90+ unique reporting data sets fulfilling 49 regulatory reporting obligations coming from 20 different legal acts within the acquis of DG ENV;**
  - **EEA Core Data Flows added**
- A governance instrument allowing to:
  - **incrementally build comparable INSPIRE maturity across MS for all INSPIRE components (metadata, services, interoperability, data sharing) based on a common setting,**
  - **plan tangible and usable INSPIRE deliverables for eReporting,**
  - **monitor progress on INSPIRE implementation in general and for the reporting use case in specific**
- Action will stretch beyond 2020.

# Objectives



- Communicate ENV information priorities and expectations to MS by clearly identifying the spatial data sets relevant for environmental reporting;
- Provide guidance on consistent mapping of reporting obligations and supporting data to INSPIRE spatial objects for the development of pan-European data sets;
- Identify reporting redundancies and explore opportunities for streamlining;
- Improve the timeliness and the quality of reported data
- Promote the reuse of the INSPIRE infrastructure for reporting purposes.



## Work Programme 2017-2021

### 4 Core Tasks

- T1: Manage and update the priority list of eReporting datasets
- T2: Make data available as-is: identify datasets, document metadata, make metadata and data available on the EU geoportal by providing network services
- T3: Common and interoperable European data models per reporting obligation/data flow that are fit for purpose for the envisaged use case.
- T4: Monitor the availability of pan-European datasets



- *Major Deliverables Q2 2017- Q3 2018:*
  - **T1: priority list of data sets, version 2.0; INSPIRE Registry codelist**
  - **T2: ongoing, needs attention**
  - **T3: Models for IED & IAS developed, CDDA, Floods, MSFD & END under development**
  - **T4: Monitoring tool “Thematic Viewer” is online**
- *Q4 2018 – Q1 2019:*
  - **T1: Maintenance of the list (corrective, perfective, preventive)**
  - **T2: Focus on implementation of the list by Member States**
    - Gathering good practices for identifying national data sets
    - Promoting implementation of the list in MS, addressing implementation gaps
    - Capacity building initiatives
  - **T3: CDDA, Floods, MSFD & END.**
  - **T4: Operational monitoring.**

## **Interoperability**

23/11/2017 Implementation of [Commission Regulation \(EU\) No 1089/2010 of 23 November 2010](#) implementing Directive 2007/2/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards interoperability of spatial data sets and services for [Annex I](#) spatial data sets

21/10/2020: Other Annex II and III spatial data sets available in accordance with IRs for Annex II and III





## Follow up on implementation

- *Commission has sent a first letter to invite MS to implement the list of priority data sets end of 2017.*
- *Commission has sent two type of letters to MS in July 2018 to follow-up and to further stimulate the implementation of the list of environmental priority data sets:*
  - **frontrunners: BE,ES,AT,MT,FI,LU,NL,SK,CZ,CY,RO,PT (12)**
  - **laggers: EE,DK,BG,HR,FR,DE,EL,HU,IE,IT,LV,LT,PL,SE,SI,UK (16)**
  - **Only received 5 relevant replies from laggers: DK,IE,IT,PL,SE**
  - **FR only provided an argumentation for not delivering**



## Enforcement

- The Commission has sent a Letter of Formal Notice to 4 Member States (BG, LT, LV, PL). Compliance issues were identified concerning list of spatial data sets which are a priority for the implementation of environmental legislation on:
  - the availability of metadata
  - the availability of services to ensure access to the data
  - linking the infrastructure to the EU-geoportal
