Action 2.2 mandate

Issues

- Harmonisation for all data in scope of INSPIRE is considered cumbersome.
- The broad data scope has lead to strongly deviating data offerings.
- Support for harmonised and non-harmonised data sets without negative impact on compliance indicators (added after 65th MIG-T)
- Maximize the reuse of national implementations and avoid parallel implementation (evaluation INSPIRE)

Action

- Build on data priorities from Action 2.1 and levels of interoperability to define implementation compliance levels.
- Identify the flexibilities of the legal framework. Legal compliance has to be assured.
- Propose implementation maturity levels based on the level of interoperability, data priorities and identified legal flexibility.
- Pilot the proposed maturity levels on selected data sets.



Action 2.2 mandate

Links /dependencies

- Outcome of Action 2.1 Need-driven data prioritisation
- Interplay with Action 2.3 Simplification of INSPIRE implementation
- Feed into Action 3.1 GreenData4All

Objective

- Rendering a common and comparable implementation of the INSPIRE Directive across
 Europe more feasible and cost-effective based on common use cases, data priorities and
 fit-for-purpose interoperability levels.
- Support as-is data without negative impact on compliance indicators, maximizing reuse of existing implementations.

Deliverables

- Phase 1: Maturity levels proposal, including possible impact on existing implementation.
- Phase 2: Develop good practices that implement the maturity levels and pilot these.
- Phase 3: Develop additional guidance where needed for application of the maturity levels.



Additional boundary conditions for our work

- Technical options for publishing non-harmonised datasets can be further elaborated in MIWP Action MIWP 2.3.2 on data-service linking simplification.
- Rich non-harmonized data for national/regional/local use cases should be published under INSPIRE.
- Impact on Member States, Tools and infrastructure should be zero or minimal.
- Need for technical flexibility supporting different approaches
- Look for a legally sound solution (compliant with the current legal framework) supporting a proportionate harmonisation effort in line with the data prioritisation under MIWP Action 2.1.
- Take into consideration the conclusions and recommendations from the evaluation
 of the INSPIRE Directive. Start gathering evidence on impact and feasibility of future
 policy options to feed in a possible revision of the legal framework.



Conclusions/ Actions kick-off 13-12-2021

- There is certainly a need to further gather information on experiences, approaches and national data priorities to complement EU level priorities
- All subgroup members were invited to share their perspectives on data prioritisation, issues
 to be addressed to make the implementation more feasible and support already existing
 national infrastructures
- Make sure that we support the use of national infrastructures as much as possible to leverage the publication of richer national data sets that are used for national use cases and to increase relevance for national and regional use cases.
- Minimize compliance issues of too strict validation of non-binding technical rules.
