- The current funding (and resulting charging) arrangements often • pre-date the Green Deal. To what extent are they suited to achieving the new political objectives of decarbonisation and increased use of rail? Are there ongoing changes at national level? Is the current financial-strategic framework well positioned? How • to handle diversity of funding systems against the background of common infrastructure planning (in TEN-T) and EU-level rules on charging? Is the current level of investment enough to cover needs linked to renewal (backlog) as well as development? What are the benefits and draw backs of tax funding vs. TAC funding? Does more user charging create an incentive for better performance? Are all funding structures and their interplay equal? PRIME members are invited to actively participate in the discussion.
