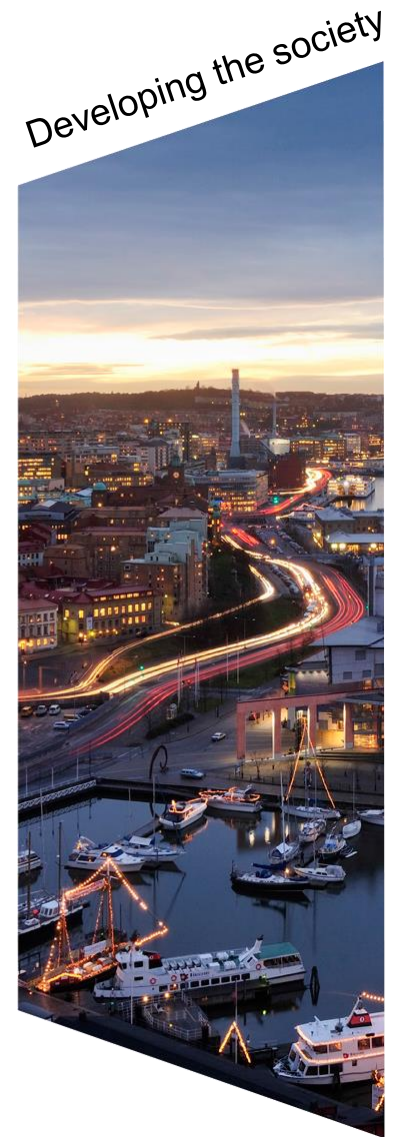
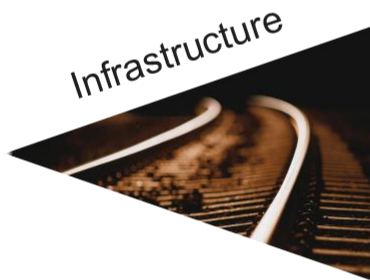
Do we need to rethink?

The Four-stage Principle



1 Rethink

Measures that can influence the need for transportation and choice of transport mode



2 Optimise

Measures that rationalise the use of existing infrastructure and vehicles



3 Rebuild

Limited reconstruction measures



4 Build new
