



Two Documents presented to boost international rail freight in Europe



Sector Statement: participating stakeholders



- Signatory associations represent: end customers (freight forwarders / shippers), customers (freight operators), intermodal operators, terminals, infrastructure managers, rail freight corridors, supply industry, and the wagon keepers
- Additionally, this initiative is supported transport ministries from the EU Member States, Switzerland and Norway, IRG-Rail and the European Commission

Aim of Sector Statement:

Improve quality, reliability, and efficiency of international rail freight

A. Making rail freight more attractive

B. Enhancing operational efficiency



C. Ensuring adequate capacity for all users

Next Steps – Support needed

- European Commission welcomed Sector Statement and decided to postpone the revision of Regulation 913/2010
- Rail sector now has the opportunity to develop its own business oriented solutions
- Rail sector is currently working on finding the most appropriate governance structure for implementing the priority actions
 - Sector associations formed the 'Sector Statement Group' (SSG) which prepared a proposal for a governance structure in May 2017
 - All stakeholders will have the opportunity to reflect on this proposal before the summer break
- Rapid progress on the implementation of the priority actions is expected
- Support of all stakeholders needed for successful implementation, especially infrastructure managers and rail freight corridors
