

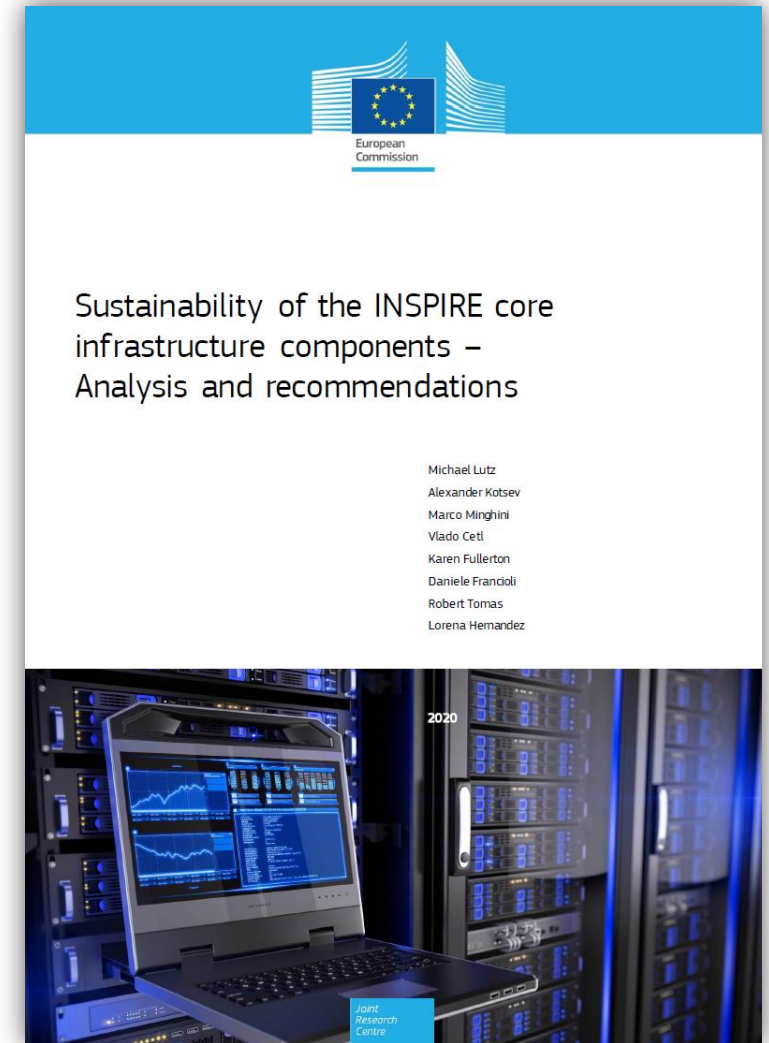


# Sustainability of INSPIRE central components

# Context

- Tools deliver what they are expected
- Maturing technology fit for purpose
- Improved transparency and dialogue with MS
- However
  - Created in different periods with different bounding conditions
  - Different technologies
  - Rooted into the infrastructure of the JRC
  - All this is costly and difficult to maintain



# The proposal

- Focus on the INSPIRE-specificity and not on mainstream tool development
- Build strategic partnerships with communities
- Harmonise the approaches for helpdesk
- Decouple tools from infrastructure
- Extensive use of the cloud for sustaining the tools
