

# 02. EC branded standardised websites design

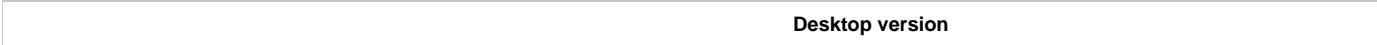
## Objective
